Degree Path and Requirements:

Associate of Arts Degree in Theater Arts. Requirement for an AA include: 33-41 program units, 1-9 units any CSU transferable course elective, and 21 units LACCD GE pattern. 3 units of program courses may be doubled towards LACCD GE Area C.

Department Advising Notes:

Program courses are offered in specific semesters and odd/even years as noted. Program courses offered every Fall and every Spring semester include TA 100, TA 240, TA 260, TA 270, TA 293, TT 340, TA 342, TT 343, TT 344, TT 345, TT 346, TT 347, TT 348 and TT 349. Fall only classes mentioned include: TA 225, TA 246, TA 265, TA 272, and TT 323. Spring only classes listed include: TA 114, TA 205, TA 273 and TT 350. The list course 2 unit practicums include: TT 342, TT 343, TT 344, TT 345, TT 346, TT 347, TT 348 and TT 349. All program courses are offered on ELAC main campus only, with the exception of TA 100. All program courses are offered on ELAC main campus only, with the exception of TA 100. We advise you take Shakespeare Festival Workshop classes TT 701-704 and TT 700. All for the purposes of portfolio and audition material. The Associate of Arts Degree in Theater Arts can be combined with the Theater in the Community Certificate of Achievement, Acting Skills Certificate, Classical Acting Skills Certificate, Language and Dialects for Performance Skills Certificate and Script Analysis Skills Certificate. These certificates better prepare students for a professional portfolio for internship and employment opportunities. Also note that TA 272: Intermediate Applied Acting is only offered in the FALL semester and it has a prerequisite of TA 260 or TA 270. Please note that TA 293 does require an audition for the class, but if you are not cast, there are other performance based classes that can be substituted for this class. *See a Theatre Arts Professor to guide you in this selection.

Program Description

Our primary AA degree provides professional training to prepare students to enter the entertainment field or transfer to a four-year institution. It is a rigorous two year program where students learn valuable skills in the major area of theater, with emphasis in acting. The program is designed for the student who recognizes the social and occupational value of this training.

Career and Transfer Opportunities

The Associate of Arts in Theater Arts prepares student to enter the entertainment field or transfer to a four-year institution. In the entertainment industry, students with a four-year or graduate level degree have a greater network and skill set which can be beneficial in a competitive field. CSU and UC schools have acting programs within their Theater Arts Departments for either a BA, BFA, MA or MFA degree. Students that obtain an AA in Theater Arts or transfer and continue study in acting will be able to pursue positions in entertainment, including: theatre, dance, theme park, live performance, corporate events, film, television, commercials, industrials and new media. Industry job titles include: actor, director, voice actor, teaching artist, and

writer.

Job descriptions include: Play parts in stage, television, radio, video, motion picture productions, or other settings for entertainment, information, or instruction. Interpret serious or comic role by speech, gesture, and body movement to entertain or inform audience. May dance and sing.

Average hourly earnings range from \$23 to \$39, based on job title. Wages for these occupations that do not generally work year-round, full time, are reported either as hourly wages or annual salaries depending on how they are typically paid.
