“My goal is to become a social worker. My dad owns a restaurant in West Covina called “La Fogata” (The Bonfire). He works really hard, but still has time to prepare food for the homeless on Skid Row. For the past six years, he gets up at 4:00 a.m. Sunday morning and cooks burritos for 200 to 300 people. We work with friends from church who gather the ingredients, help us cook and then distribute the meals and old clothes to street people. Clarence, a homeless guy, would help us distribute the food and I realized he was a person who needed help—not someone to be afraid of.”

Wrestling coach and academic counselor Ralph Valle recruited Adrian convincing him that ELAC was the best path to a university. Adrian was captain of the wrestling team last year and finished in the top ten for his weight class in the statewide finals. He is proud of completing lower division requirements in two years and hopes to transfer to one of the University of California campuses. Adrian credits his professors, especially Dr. Kahla and Professor Oropesa, for their positive energy and inspiration. “They gave me so many new ways to think about the world,” he comments. “They encouraged me to connect-the-dots so now I know that I need to understand the political system to have a positive impact on disadvantaged people.”

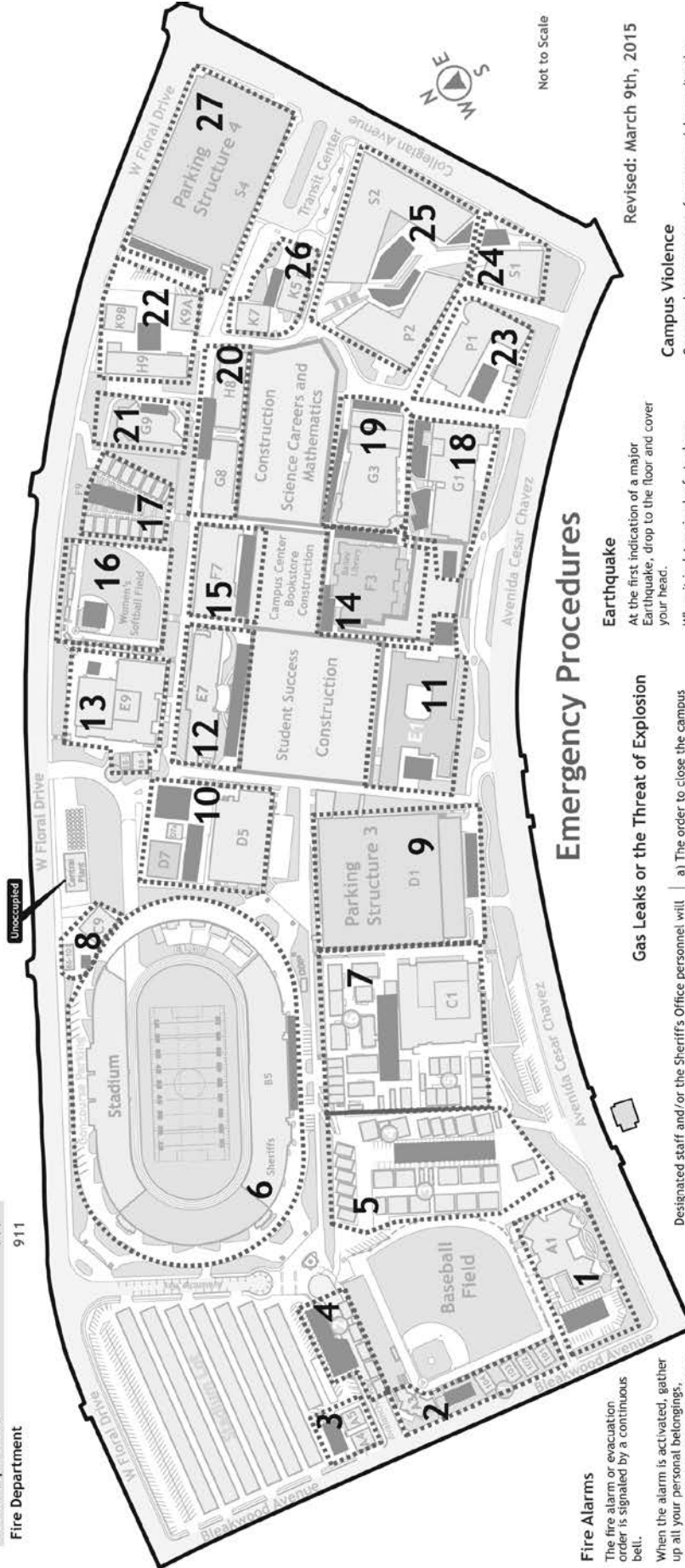

Fire Alarms

The fire alarm or evacuation order is signaled by a continuous bell.

When the alarm is activated, gather up all your personal belongings, turn off any source of gas and leave the building. The last person to exit the room should close the door behind them. Proceed to the nearest Evacuation Assembly Point (EAP) as shown on the Evacuation Zones map.

Do not use the elevator.

Wait at the E.A.P. until receiving further instructions from a Safety Marshall or via ELAC emergency notification systems.

Designated staff and/or the Sheriff's Office personnel will contact each building, office, classroom or laboratory via ELAC's emergency notification systems to advise specific areas of the need to evacuate to a safe location.

No bells, cell phones, radios or bull horns will be used to announce the need to evacuate due to the possibility of detonation or explosion.

The individual advising you to evacuate will direct you to a safe evacuation area.

Once at the evacuation area, wait for further instructions from either the assigned Safety Marshal or responding emergency personnel.

Gas Leaks or the Threat of Explosion

a) The origin to close the campus will order to close the highest ranking administrator / employee on campus at the time of the incident in consultation with the Office of the LACCD Chancellor.

b) You will be advised that the area is clear of all potential hazards and that you can return to your work station or classroom via ELAC's emergency notification systems.

Earthquake

At the first indication of a major Earthquake, drop to the floor and cover your head.

When it is determined safe to do so, exit the building to the Emergency Assembly Point (EAP). Be aware of falling debris from buildings, downed power lines, broken gas lines, and any other overhead danger.

Do not use elevators.

Wait at the EAP for further instructions.

Emergency Procedures

Campus Violence

Once you become aware of a campus violence situation, call the Sheriff's Office at (323) 265-8800 or call 911.

Try to ascertain if it is safer to evacuate the building or barricade yourself in the room.

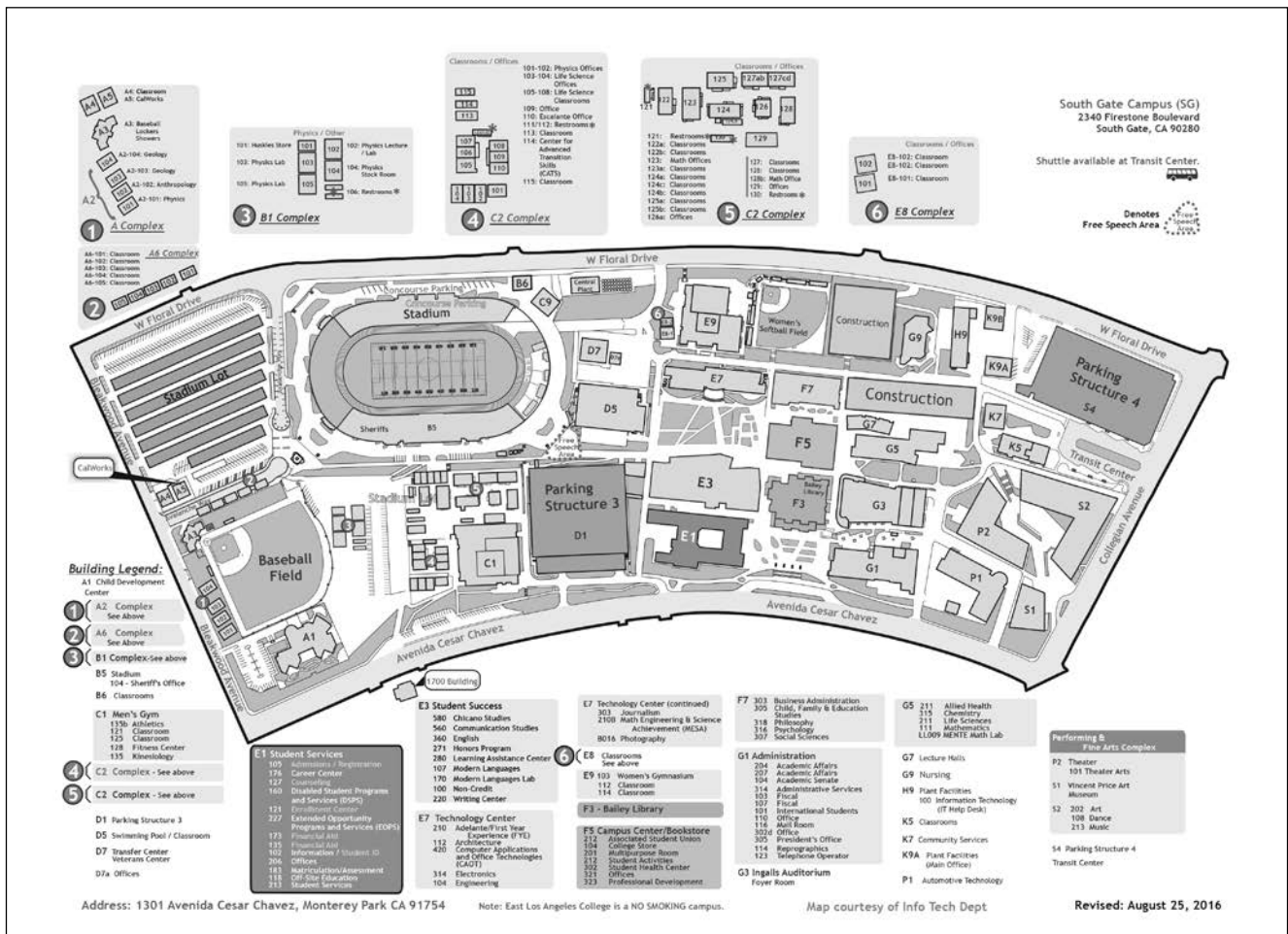
