# ELAC Pathway to Law School Transfer Program



The Pathway to Law School is an academic program at ELAC which offers ELAC students a path to go to law school and become a lawyer. The program is part of the statewide Pathway to Law School initiative begun by the State Bar of California's Council on Access and Fairness (COAF) with support from the Law School Admission Council (LSAC). Students in the program take core courses and participate in activities that are designed to help students learn from (and network with) law schools, attorneys, judges, and other legal professionals. Students earn a certificate after completing the program that is recognized by the following top undergraduate universities and their respective law schools: UC Berkeley, UCLA, UCI, UC Davis, USC, University of San Francisco, Chapman, Loyola, Pepperdine, University of the Pacific, Santa Clara University. Undergraduate CSU partners include CSU Bakersfield, CSU Sacramento, and CSU San Bernadino.
