This Associate of Science in Administration of Justice degree is designed for students wishing to complete work for a Bachelors Degree in criminal justice or related field. Students will be able to describe the individual functions and components of the modern criminal justice system; use introductory concepts of legal research to locate, analyze, and discuss the content of statutory and case law; and apply critical thinking skills to solve a criminal justice problem. Proper selection of curriculum electives further enables students to study other academic disciplines, such as sociology, and public administration.
