Program Description

The Interventional Radiology Coding certificate prepares individuals seeking to work as coders for a radiology department or other healthcare setting where procedures are performed on the gastrointestinal, genitourinary, biliary, cardiovascular, and other body systems. Upon completion of the Coding

Specialist courses, students complete one additional course to learn how to abstract and analyze radiologic documentation to become proficient in radiologic procedural coding specifically related to non-vascular interventional radiology.

Career and Transfer Opportunities

Interventional Radiology Coder; According to the Medical Coding Health Care Salary Survey of 2013 by the American Association of Professional Coders (AAPC), interventional radiology is one of the top wage earning specialties. Due to the overwhelming need for experts in the Interventional Radiology Cardiovascular specialty, the AAPC now offers the CIRCC® (Certified Interventional Radiology Cardiovascular Coder) credential. Since interventional radiology coding and charging error rates are known to be high for this radiology subspecialty, the CIRCC® credential helps validate this additional level of education, knowledge and expertise required by the individuals who work in the complex and specialized areas of interventional radiology and cardiovascular coding and charging. Individuals seeking the CIRCC credential must have either a CPC or CCS to take the exam. In addition to AAPC, the Radiology Coding Certification Board (RCCB), with over 900 members certifies individuals who successfully meet its standards, policies and procedures, and pass the certification exam. To work as an interventional radiology coder, most settings require that individuals have at least one national certification to be hired.

Many of the jobs for interventional radiology coding are remote or telecommuting jobs. [AAPC's](#) 2013. Job listings for radiology coders as of 12/9/15 from companies such as Indeed.com (130), Simply Hired (80), Glassdoor (100), Career Builders (60), and Monsters (50), to name a few, indicate a great need for coders with this type of skill. Since this is a profession that may be completed remotely, the labor market needs are reflective of companies within and out of our regional area, which means individuals seeking employment as radiology coders may be employed throughout the country remotely. The national salary range for interventional radiology coders (IRCs) start at \$48,500 and above. Regionally, IRCs make approximately \$40.00/hour.
