All other journalism and public relations classes are offered day and night in spring and fall semesters only, but not every class is at night every semester. News production classes are To Be Arranged and will fit around a student's schedule. All classes are on the Monterey Park campus.

Program Description

This program will students skills in the fields of Graphic Design, Journalism and Media Arts and in the use of computers to produce newspapers, newsletters, advertising and brochures.

Career and Transfer Opportunities

In addition to careers in journalistm, the journalism style of writing is excellent preparation for a career in law, both as a lawyer and as a police officer. It gives people in business or government an ability to communicate with employees or bosses. Students in the Journalism Department learn their craft by actually writing, reporting, editing, photographing, and making videos or podcasts. They publish the student newspaper, Campus News, both in print and on the website ELACCampusnews.com. They also have many forms of social media connected with Campus News.
