Degree Path and Requirements:

This map is a suggested term-by-term sequence of courses to complete the program in a recommended time frame. - ATI TEAS Score (latest version) must be greater than or equal to 62%.

Non-graduate, not eligible for Associate Degree in Nursing

Upon completion of the program, the student is eligible for NCLEX-RN licensing exam.

30-UNIT OPTION for LVN to RN (Non-graduate)

For this option, the LVN takes a maximum of 30 units in the core program and then is eligible to sit for boards. The primary requirement is the LVN license. All prerequisite courses and bridge courses count toward the 30 units. Upon satisfactory completion of the program, the student is eligible to sit for state boards; however, they should be aware of the facts about their California license:

- The student has a California RN license that reads RN without degree. This will never change even if the students should get the ADN degree or BSN or Ph.D. at a later date.
- This license has reciprocity in very few others so the student will have limited ability to work as an RN outside of the state of California.
- Once the student chooses this pathway, the student cannot change their mind.

Program Description

East Los Angeles College provides the California Board of Registered Nursing approved pre-licensure program that is designed to educate a diverse population of students for an entry level registered nursing position. The program consists of coursework in general education, science, nursing, and clinical practice in various in-patient and out-patient settings. Nursing course content include pharmacology, fundamentals of nursing, medical surgical nursing, obstetrics, pediatric, psychiatric/mental health, and management/leadership nursing. The ELAC RN program prepares students to be caring, safe, and competent members of the nursing workforce in healthcare settings. Upon completion of the program, the graduates will be eligible to take the National Council for Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN). Successful passing of the NCLEX-RN will lead to licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN).
