Degree Path and Requirements:

This program requires the above listed courses, which include ten classes and two internships.

This map is a suggested term-by-term sequence of courses to complete the program in a recommended time frame. This is an efficient and recommended plan, but actual plans may vary by individual student need. This map cannot replace a meeting with counselors.

When the ten required courses are completed, students will apply to department-approved internship sites. Students who complete this program will have met the requirements for the Addiction Prevention Specialist Certificate and Addiction Recovery Specialist Skills Certificate.

Some students who follow this program also pursue the Psychology AA-T. There are three courses in this program, PSYCH 001, 014, 043, that satisfy three Psychology AA-T requirements.

Program Description

The Psychology Department offers this Certificate of Achievement for Addiction Studies Counselor as part of its Addiction Studies Program. This certificate provides academic preparation and fieldwork experience for individuals employed, or preparing for employment, in public and private agencies that serve clients with substance abuse issues.

Career and Transfer Opportunities

This program satisfies the requirements for state certification. One hundred percent of graduates are offered employment in the substance abuse treatment field. Many of these opportunities come from their internship placements.

Visit the Transfer Center for transfer information, which varies based on transfer college. Make an appointment with a counselor. Students can visit Career and Job Services for career counseling and further exploration. For additional resources, students pursuing a certificate can visit the American Job Center of California on ELAC main campus.
