Degree Path and Requirements:

The Associate in Arts degree for Transfer in Social Justice: Gender Studies is designed to meet the minimum requirements for transfer to a California State University (CSU) Bachelor of Arts Degree program in Women Studies, Gender Studies, or a related field at a CSU. The transfer degree assures a competitive advantage for transfer opportunities at CSUs. The degree provides a foundational set of preparatory courses designed to maximize their transfer success as they pursue a degree in Women Studies, Gender Studies or a related field.

Students are required to complete a minimum of 60 semester units of CSU transferable coursework with a minimum GPA or 2.0, including a minimum of 18 units in the major with a grade of "C" for each course in the major, and completion of the IGETC or the CSU GE requirements.

Department Advising Notes:

Social Justice Studies- Gender Studies AA-T degree is part of an interdisciplinary program called Women and Gender Studies (WGS). WGS courses are interdisciplinary, therefore they double count for the Social Justice Studies- Gender Studies AA-T degree as well as for subject degree. For example, PHILOS 044 counts for the Social Justice Studies- Gender Studies AA-T degree and for the Philosophy degree. Program Description

This degree is one of the two degrees offered within the Women and Gender Studies (WGS) Program. The Associate in Art in Social Justice: Gender Studies for Transfer degree is an interdisciplinary academic program which aims to expand students' understanding and appreciation of women's lives and experiences, both historically and in contemporary societies worldwide. In the Women and Gender Studies curriculum, students are exposed to the scholarship and theoretical framework of Women and Gender studies and learn how the application of a gendered lens has challenged traditional, historical, and cultural assumptions.

Career and Transfer Opportunities

This Transfer Degree is part of the ADT degrees that provide certain advantages to students who plan to transfer to CSU. See this link for additional information. The WGS committee has worked closely with CSULB and CSULA to coordinate transfer requirements with their WGS programs. Generally, Women/Gender Studies (under various names) at the Cal States are not impacted majors and willingly accept transfer students. A degree in Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies prepares you for almost anything. The demand for expertise on gender issues is growing in the professions of law, health care, social work, teaching, counseling, and government service. Specialists in gender and sexuality are sought out as consultants in education and industry. And women's

agencies and organizations are adding to the demand for graduates in the field as they take on ever more critical roles, both internationally and within local communities.
