

## **California State Grants**

California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) administers the following programs for Community College:

- Cal Grant B, and C:
- California Chafee Grant
  - Offers to current or former foster youth student between age of 16 to 18
- Law Enforcement Personnel Dependents Grant
  - Dependent or spouse of a California peace officer, investigator, highway patrol, marshals, sheriffs, police officers, firefighters, or certain other law enforcement employees who died or became 100 percent disabled in the line of duty.
- California Community College Promise Grant (CCPG)
  - Offers to students who attend the California Community College system (CCC)

## **Cal Grants**

Students must meet the following general eligibility requirements for the Cal Grant Programs:

- Be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen or be classified as an AB 540 student by our Admissions & Records Office
- Have a valid Social Security Number (SSN) (not require for AB540 student)
- Be a California resident
- Be attending at least half-time enrollment status
- Have financial need
- Be making Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)
- Have not already earned a BA/BS degree
- Attend an eligible California School
- Not be in default on a Federal student loan
- Not be incarcerated
- Meet income and asset ceilings as established by CSAC

**Students must submit a GPA Verification and FAFSA (or California Dream Act Application for AB 540 students) by the applicable deadlines to the California Student Aid Commission.**

Note: GPA verification for students enrolled within the Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) will be electronically sent to the Commission by the deadline date for those who meet the following criteria:

- Completed 16 to 24 units within LACCD
- Had active enrollment status within the last 365 days prior to the application deadline

## **Types of available Cal Grants:**

### **Entitlement Grants**

- **Cal Grant A-** (four year private or public university) provides grant funds to help pay for tuition/fees at qualifying institutions offering baccalaureate degree programs. If you receive a Cal Grant A but choose to attend a CA community college first, your award will be held in reserve for up to three years until you transfer to a four-year college.
- **Cal Grant B-** provides subsistence payments for recipients in the amount of \$1,648 maximum for the academic year. Disbursement is based on enrollment status:
  - Full time - \$1,648/year
  - Three Quarter time – \$1,236/year
  - Half Time- \$824/ year
  - Less than half time = not eligible\*Cal Grant B recipients who transfer to a tuition/fee-charging school after completing one or two years at a community college may have their grant increased to include tuition and fees as well as subsistence.
- **Cal Grant Transfer Entitlement Award** – This award is for eligible CA Community College students who are transferring to a four-year college and are under the age of 28 as of December 31<sup>st</sup> of the award year. Must apply by March 2 in the year you plan to transfer.
- Student who meets the qualification for the Dependent Children Award may receive up to \$6000 per year.
- Student must meet the dependent children award criteria:
  - Dependent children must be 18 years of age and receive more than 50% of their support from the student.
  - The student must complete a self-certification on the California Student Aid Commission website, [mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov](http://mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov)
  - Institutions are required to resolve any conflicting information regarding student eligibility prior to disbursement

- Foster youth student who meets the eligibility requirements may receive up to \$6000 per year. Certification will be provided by CSAC.

### **Competitive Grants**

- **Cal Grant A and B Competitive Awards** - are used for the same purpose as the entitlement awards, except that they are not guaranteed and the number of awards is limited.
- **Cal Grant C-** recipients are selected based on financial need and vocational aptitude. Students must be enrolled in a vocational program at a California Community College, private college, or career technical school in a course of study lasting from four months to two years. Maximum annual award amount for community college recipient is \$1,094. Student who meets the qualification for the Dependent Children Award may receive up to \$4000 per academic year. Student must meet the dependent award criteria listed above to be eligible for the award.

### **California Chafee Grant:**

Up to \$5,000 a year for job training or college in addition to any other state or federal aid you receive.

- You are or were in foster care between 16 to 18
- Stay in school and maintain good grades
- Be enrolled at least half-time enrollment status
- Complete a Chafee Grant application, contact the Financial Aid & Scholarship Office for additional information

### **Law Enforcement Personnel Dependents (LEPD) Grant**

LEPD Grant program awards math the amount of a Cal Grant for up to four years.

- Dependent or spouse of a California peace officer, investigator, highway patrol, marshals, sheriffs, police officers, firefighters, or certain other law enforcement employees who died or became 100 percent disabled in the line of duty.
