In addition to careers in journalism, the journalism style of writing is excellent preparation for a career in law, both as a lawyer and as a police officer. It gives people in business or government an ability to communicate with employees or bosses. Students in the Journalism Department learn their craft by actually writing, reporting, editing, photographing, and making videos or podcasts. They publish the student newspaper, Campus News, both in print and on the <u>ELAC Campus News Website</u>. They also have many forms of social media connected with Campus News.
