A wide variety of immersive courses include instruction in lighting, digital image manipulation, digital cinema and video production, custom printing, portraiture, visual communications, marketing, concept and portfolio development. These classes provide our students with the knowledge necessary to succeed in challenging and exciting fields and, prepare you for career advancement, or assist in making a career transition. Our facility has over eight separate teaching labs including black and white and color darkrooms, a film processing lab, a commercial studio, computer lab and a variety of professional equipment for students to use.

Photographers are problem solvers who combine artistry, technique, design, and creativity to make compelling images that tell a story. The digital revolution and increasingly sophisticated imaging software mean photography is now limited only by imagination.
