Degree Path and Requirements:

Non-credit Program: Tailoring Certificate of Achievement. This map is a suggested term-by-term sequence of courses to complete the program in a recommended time frame. Department Advising Notes:

The Tailoring Certificate of Achievement is a non-credit program which can lead to the credit costume program in the Theatre Arts Department. In the credit program there is an Associate of Arts Degree in Theatre Arts with a costume emphasis, an Associate of Arts Degree in Theatre Arts for Transfer with a costume focus, and a Certificate of Achievement in Costume Design and Technology. There are related stackable Skills Certificates available in this program entitled Costume Design Skills Certificate, Wardrobe Skills Certificate, and Costume Technology Skills Certificate. These certificates better prepare students for a professional portfolio for internship and employment opportunities. The Tailoring Certificate of Achievement can also serve students already working in the costuming field looking to increase their skill set in tailored and mens garment construction.

Program Description

The Tailoring Certificate of Achievement provides students withessential skills in cutting, sewing and constructing tailored and mens garments. This noncredit program can lead to the credit Costume program in the Theatre Arts Department or to supplement a previously earned degree in costuming.

Career and Transfer Opportunities

Students that obtain this certificate will be able to pursue entry or mid-level positions in tailoring. Job titles include Tailor, Seamstress, Alterations Expert, Alterations Sewer, Hand Sewer, and Custom Sewers.

Job descriptions include: fit and study garments on customers to determine required alterations, sew garments using needles and thread or sewing machines, measure parts such as sleeve or pants legs and mark or pin-fold alteration lines, take up or let down hems to shorten or lengthen garment parts and let out or take in seams in suits and other garments to improve fit.

Entry level hourly wages are between \$10.86 and \$13.99. Experienced workers earn between \$25.56 and \$64.06. The average hourly earnings for an experienced Tailor is \$23.14 in LA County.
