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*Life Experience or Special Circumstances

- 1. **Individuals with Disabilities** Students reported with a primary disability anytime since fall 1990 through the current time- period are in the Students with Disabilities category. This is reported in MIS data element SD01 Student-Primary-Disability.
- 2. **Non-traditional Fields** -- A non-traditional student is a student that is in a program that leads to an occupation where their gender represents less than 25% of those employed. (Examples would be woman in automotive or men in nursing)
- 3. First Generation College Student- a student whose parent(s) did not complete a four-year college or university degree.
- 4. **Socially or educationally disadvantaged**—A individual is considered socially and or educationally disadvantaged if: student received a Promise grant and/or Pell Grant; has been identified as a WIOA participant; is a recipient of public aid (as defined by the California Department of Public Social Services).
- 5. **Low Income**: an individual whose family's taxable income for the preceding year did not exceed 150 percent of the poverty level amount, a person who lives in a household whose income is below average.

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
