

# ADM JUS 001 • Introduction To Administration Of Justice (UC/CSU) • 3 Units

Requirement Designation: Meets IGETC 4H; CSU D8

Philosophy, history, and theories of the criminal justice system, including the roles and functions of the local, state, and federal jurisdictions. Theories, functions, and interrelationships among criminal justice agencies; law enforcement, courts, and corrections; crime causation, correctional theory, analysis and the social impact of crime. The conceptual approach utilized in this course recognizes that criminal justice is itself a distinct academic discipline rather than an interdisciplinary course of study.

The course also includes an analysis of techniques of crime site recording and search, follow-up, case preparation, and organization.

Topics covered include the key elements of ethical guidelines, individual aspects of the ethical code, procedural and substantive law issues pertaining to crime scene investigations, courtroom testimony and admissibility issues, and ethical standards for all written reports.

This course centers on the lived experiences of those of African descent from the Reconstruction Era to the present. This course examines the Reconstruction period and analyzes both the twentieth century and early twenty-first century black progress movements in the contexts of race, equity, gender, Black feminism, and social justice in contemporary black history. This course documents the laws, policies, and culture that negatively impacted African Americans and helps students understand the theories and motivations behind racial behavior and race-based social patterns and attitudes that forged U.S. political, social, and economic inter-race relations from 1865 to the present. Included is a survey of the U.S. Constitution.
