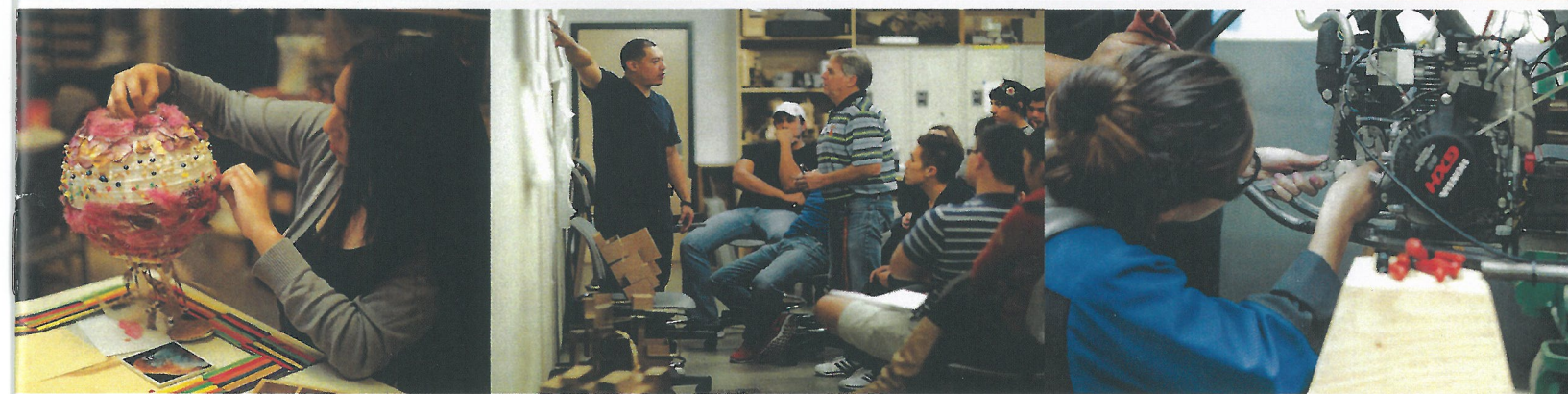

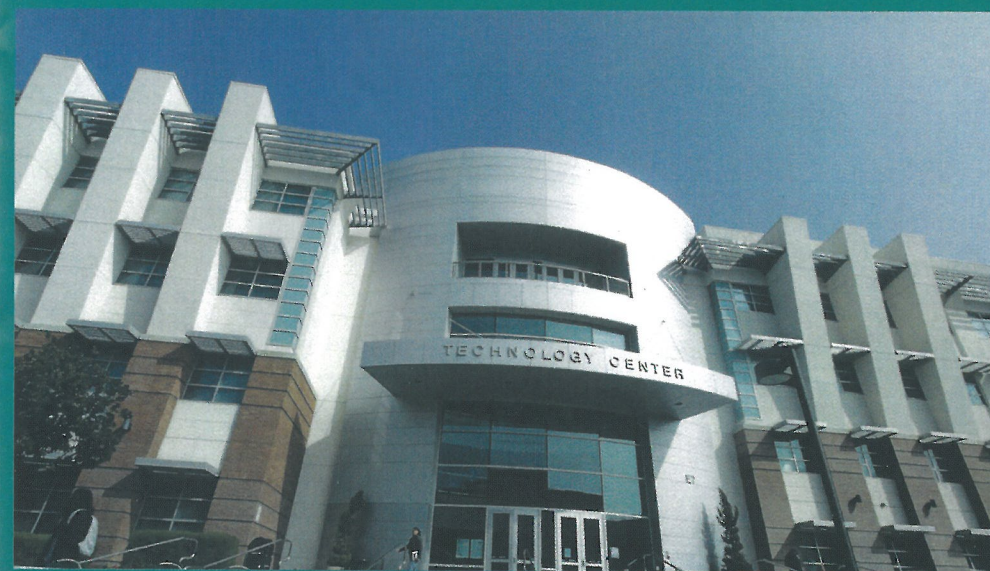




**East Los Angeles College** is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). The college was established in 1945 and is situated in a secure, comfortable environment in the suburban community of Monterey Park, conveniently located 8 miles east of downtown Los Angeles.

Our international and multicultural student body of over 30,000 students complements the communities that ELAC serves. ELAC grants Associate in Arts/Science (A.A./A.S.) degrees as well as Certificate Programs.

Our college offers excellent programs in Career Technical Education as well as academic preparations for transfers to four-year universities. Currently, over 600 International Students from over thirty different countries are enrolled at ELAC. The college is on a semester system. There are two semesters in the college year, fall and spring; summer and winter sessions are optional. Our international Students have transferred to universities throughout the United States, particularly prestigious California institutions such as the University of California Los Angeles, the University of California Berkeley, and the University of Southern California.

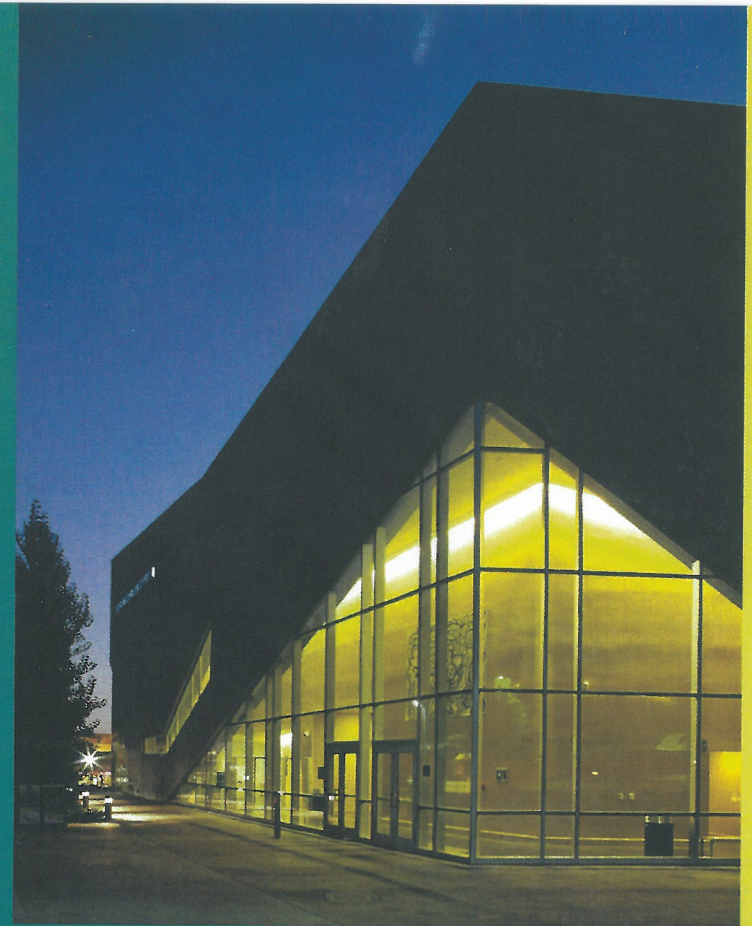

The academic calendar includes a fall semester, winter session, spring semester, and summer session. Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis prior to fall and spring semesters. Application deadlines and start dates are listed on the college website ([www.elac.edu](http://www.elac.edu)). International students (F-1) are required to have a minimum TOEFL score of 450 (133 Computer-based TOEFL or Internet Based Test 45), an iTEP score of 3.5 or an IELTS minimum score of 5. Students from Japan may use the official STEP Eiken 2A grade level or higher for admission purpose.

Articulation agreements are formal partnerships between East Los Angeles College and four-year institutions that outline specific courses and grades completed at our colleges that will transfer to the university. These partnerships provide a simplified transfer process for transfer students.

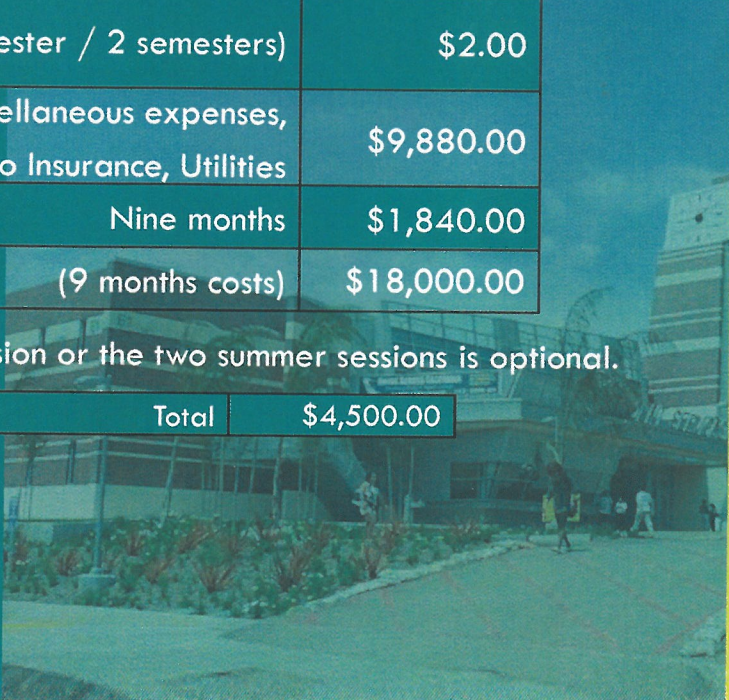

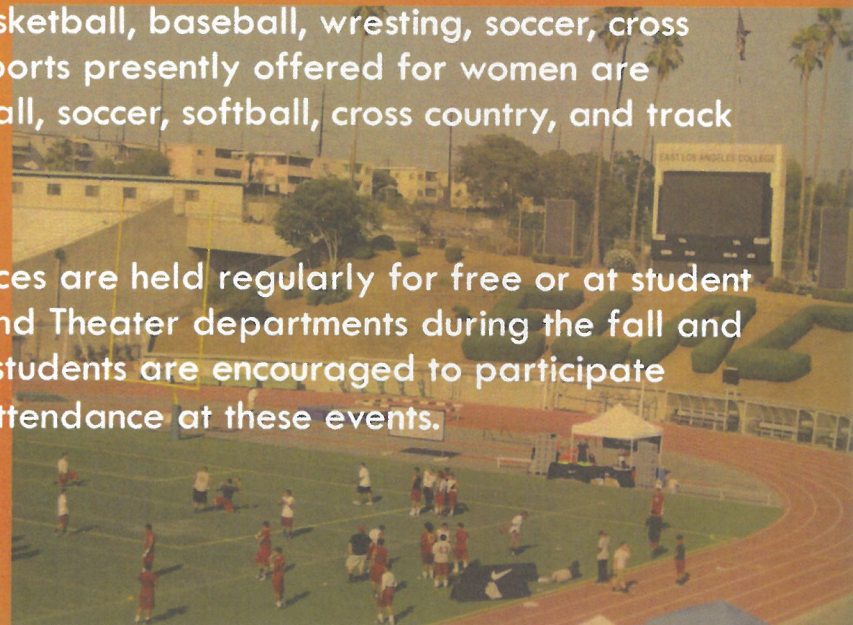

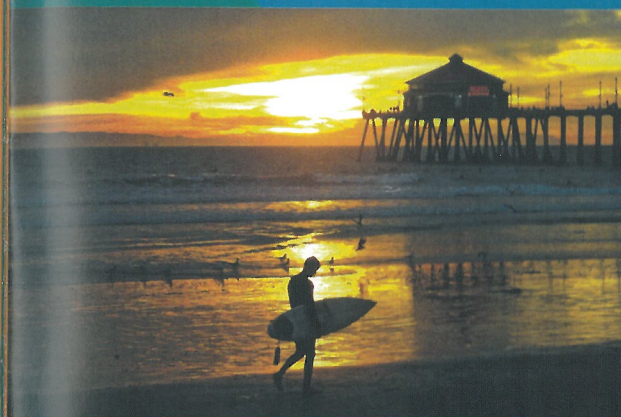


East Los Angeles College offers many social and cultural opportunities to experience life in the United States.

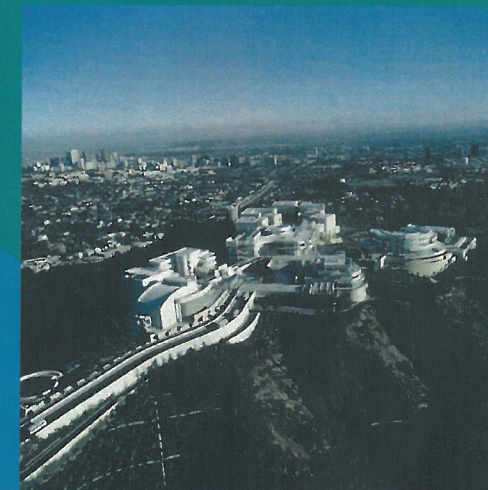
- **Vincent Price Art Museum (VPAM)** – VPAM provides an environment to encounter a range of aesthetic expressions that illuminate the depth and diversity of artwork produced by people of the world, both contemporary and past.
- **Student Activities** - International students are encouraged to take advantage of the programs offered by our Student Activities Office which includes student clubs, extra-curricular activities, drives, commencement, major cultural events, ASU/Club events, and award luncheons.
- **Intercollegiate Athletics:** ELAC offers 16 competitive intercollegiate athletic programs for both men and women. Sports presently offered for men are American football, basketball, baseball, wrestling, soccer, cross country, and track and field. Sports presently offered for women are badminton, basketball, volleyball, soccer, softball, cross country, and track and field.
- **Music and Theater:** Performances are held regularly for free or at student price by ELAC's Dance, Music and Theater departments during the fall and spring semesters. International students are encouraged to participate through specific classes or by attendance at these events.



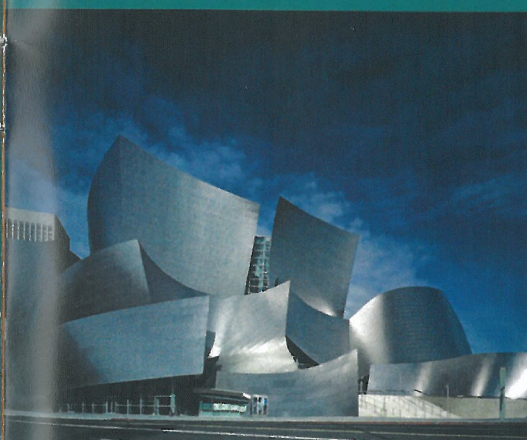

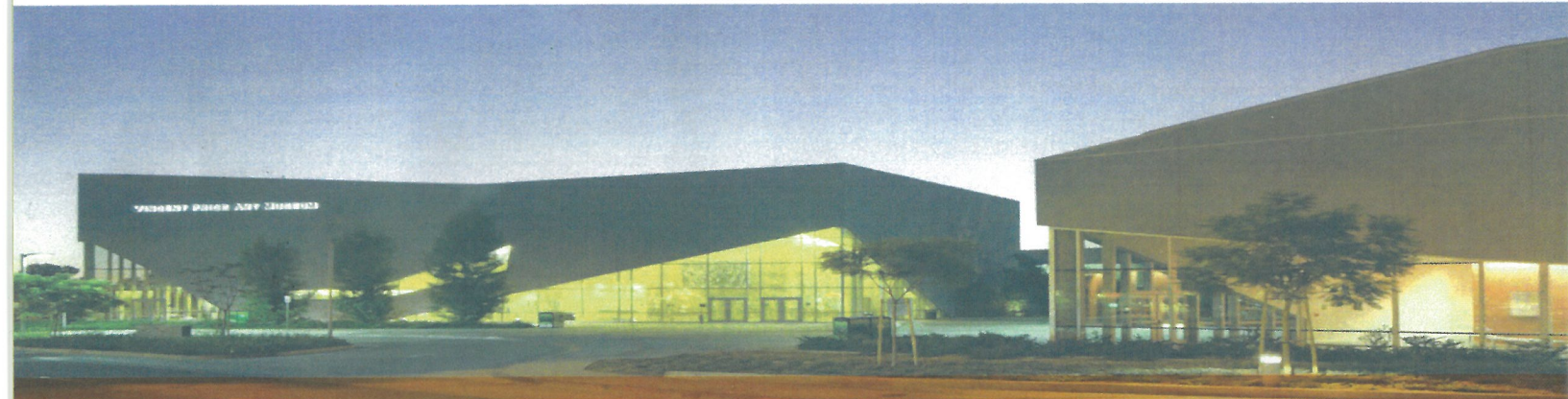
